Our Church Staff Team:

After a process involving various conversations and interviews in late 2024 and early 2025, Michael Nelson began to serve as our Associate Pastor (with a major focus in worship and music) this past April. And I am so very thankful that he is with us! Michael and Brittni and their four boys settled into their house here in West Chester, and they dove into our church family life. I really appreciate the steady, thoughtful, wise, and encouraging presence Michael brings to our worship life and to our church body life on the whole.

What's more, I am deeply thankful for the entire staff team God has assembled here at Goshen—with Tara Mummert holding down the fort in the office (she's been here almost 10 years!), Lori Herson serving in family and children's ministries, and Jake Lawton ministering with students. Plus Melanie Aber assisting in children's ministry, Denise Parshall helping out in the office, Russ Nixon helping us all stay on track, Jason Grothmann and Nate Koechig managing all of our facilities and grounds, and Jen Duguid and her team blessing area families through Goshen Baptist Preschool.

Proclaiming God's Word:

I began the year with a sermon series called "Entrusted" to help us reflect on what it means to be good stewards of time, talent, treasure, and truth. Then in the spring came the series, "Anticipation," to focus our attention on weighty and wonderful eternal things. I then did a short series on several of the Psalms, and in much of the summer we were in the Minor Prophets unpacking messages on "Warning & Hope." Last fall I preached on "Exploring Faith" (asking just what it means to believe in Jesus), and I ended the year with a series called "Truth & Love: Christian Cultural Engagement."

Sunday Seminars:

Last spring I led a Sunday Seminar on "Questioning AI: Artificial Intelligence & the Christian Life" (to help us grapple with what it means to be made in God's image). And last fall I led a Sunday Seminar entitled "Under Deconstruction: Faith Formation & Restoration" (in which Rick James shared about his book, Jesus Reconstructed). I personally was stretched and enriched by preparing for these in-depth sessions, and I very much appreciated all of the thoughtful input from the Goshen family.

Stepping back and looking ahead into a new year, I thank God for his saving grace, the lamp of his Word, the presence of his Spirit, the sure hope of heaven, and the privilege of being part of Goshen. It's an honor to serve as your Senior Pastor!

We have received a gift of infinite value in God's inerrant, life-giving Word. Preaching and teaching it fills me with humility, joy, awe, and wonder every time. I'm grateful for the opportunities to preach several times this year and teach occasional Sunday School classes. (Psalm 138:2)

What a privilege to gain insight into various ministries and connect with their leaders in my role as staff liaison to the Deacons, Building & Property Committee, and Finance team. Goshen is blessed with competent, caring, and compassionate leaders. (1 Thessalonians 1:2-3)

How comforting to know that God has not asked us to walk this journey of faith alone! He has given us the gift of community, a family to encourage and refine us. My family has felt the love and support of Goshen as we transitioned here earlier this year. Brittni and I have also begun meeting with and leading a small group with five other couples that meets in our home, exploring the Gospel of John as we pray and care for each other. (Acts 2:42-47)

The children's ministry at Goshen thrives on the gifted and caring volunteers who pour into our children every year. Whether through snack donations, birthday card greetings, helping at special ministry moments, nursery care or teaching and leading in Children's Church, KTC, Sunday school, Awana, and VBS, our adults and teens who faithfully serve are the heartbeat of this ministry. Thank you for blessing our church family with your time, energy, and commitment to training a younger generation to know and love the Lord.

Highlight events and activities from our 2025 year include the continuation of our 2nd Sunday family suppers, August Goshen Sports Camp, December Parents' Night out, and Game Night in February. Our Sunday morning offerings expanded to include a younger preschool Sunday school and Children's Church room. Our mid-week Awana ministry hosted (and continues to host) almost fifty K-5th graders. With the help of about sixty volunteers, our summer VBS program, *True North*, welcomed around 125 children in preschool through 5th grade. In the spring, we were challenged to see the unique creation of all types of reptiles through our visit with experts from the "Forgotten Friends" sanctuary.

This summer we hosted two training events for our Goshen volunteers. The first training certified approximately fifteen individuals in CPR/First Aid and AED. We hosted our local Awana representative for our 2nd training and considered ways that we can effectively teach our children in God's Word.

Additional opportunities for families to grow and connect happen through our Family Foundations Sunday school class, Trunk or Treat, and Tuesday morning women's Bible study.

It is a privilege to pray for our Goshen families and children. I know there are many in our church congregation who join with me in asking for God's protection and provision and that Goshen's dads, moms, and kids would pursue God and His Word in their families and homes.

2025 has been a great year for Goshen Student Ministries. Highlights from the year include our first Winter Peak retreat and our first summer missions trip to Camp Promise. We have also adjusted our youth group programming, welcomed in a handful of new volunteers, and kept events like Waypoint and the Lock-In going strong.

Attendance at youth group is roughly 30-35 kids per week. A majority of them are in high school, but the middle school has grown significantly as well. We thank the Lord for his faithfulness in growing GSM and helping more and more students to hear the word of God.

Last year we took a total of four people to Camp Promise for a mission trip. We served as counselors at a day camp for people with special needs for a week. All of those who attended loved the trip, and did a wonderful job of serving the Lord and the campers. This year we are planning to return, and at least six kids are interested in attending.

We praise God for a lot of fun and successful events last year as well. Our Lock-In was a massive hit, and the winter retreat was a great experience. We have already done our Lock-In for the 2025-26 school year, and are planning to attend the Winter Peak retreat again. And of course, Waypoint was an excellent kickoff to the summer, with roughly 75 kids and 40 volunteers attending throughout the week. We look forward to another great Waypoint in 2026. Please join me in praying for all of these events and the lives of the kids that they will impact.

We have also started smaller discipleship groups for the high school students. These are optional studies for kids who want to go deeper with their faiths and learn more about what it means to walk with the Lord. These evenings are the highlight of my week, and have been a great way to connect the students to the leaders and to one another.

Going forward, I would love for the youth ministry to be more involved in volunteering and being involved in other areas of church life. We are planning a trip to help with a homeless ministry in January, and will hopefully find other avenues to serve our community, both near and far.

You can be praying for me (Jake) and the other volunteer leaders, that we would serve the Lord and the students well and make wise decisions about programming, events, and study topics. And most of all, you can pray for the students, that God would speak to them and change their hearts so that they want to love and follow Him. We praise the Lord for all He has done in 2025 and eagerly anticipate what He will do next year!

Adult Ministries Team

In the fall of 2024, we began to track Adult Sunday School Attendance. On average we had 65 “students” spread across four classes. In the winter of 2025, attendance jumped to an average of 80 students per Sunday, growing to 82 in the spring and averaging 85 in the fall. Though at the same time, Goshen attendance has grown, Adult Sunday School attendance has grown even more. This is a great encouragement. New to Goshen regular attenders are plugging into our Adult Sunday School program.

We have maintained the same four classes we had in 2024, three being team taught and one taught by an individual. Over the past 2 years long-standing teachers have stepped back and new teachers have stepped forward. We continued our summer Sunday School program that broadens opportunities for others in our church to teach and share and we have supplemented our “school year” classes with seminar series taught by our pastor and the elders.

Goshen Baptist is blessed with members and regular attendees desiring to grow deeper in their knowledge of God’s word and a great base of teachers who continue to use their spiritual gifts and do the hard work of lesson preparation to serve the church.

We were blessed to find out in late December that the congregation gave sufficiently to meet our church budget for 2025. Thank you to everyone who participated and gave so graciously towards the work God is doing at Goshen Baptist Church. The blessing of meeting our budget in 2025 will ensure that our ministries remain strong in 2026 and can continue doing the work of growing God's Kingdom.

As an elder group, in addition to meeting monthly to discuss administrative and spiritual guidance for the church we've continued to study together as well. In the Spring, we read through *Confronting Christianity* by Rebecca McLaughlin. Finance Team

2025 Recap:

Thanks to Larry Bazar for the years he served on the finance team. Leigh Ann Tedrow will be taking over his duties of Financial Secretary (handling invoice payments and payroll). Kevin Braun is the new Financial Steward in 2026 (handling receipts/donations).

The financial year ended with receipts exceeding expenses by \$42K due to late year extra-ordinary giving. See the Steward's Report for details.

Working Capital is consistently in the \$350K range. The year ended with \$422K in Working Capital again due to year end giving. It is in the best interest to preserve Working Capital.

E-Giving was moved from Ministry Brands to Planning Center, which produced savings in fees. The move also consolidated the tracking of giving with other GBC Planning Center activities.

Payroll was moved from Quickbooks to OnPay to reduce processing fees. Leigh Ann is evaluating if OnPay is the best tool for GBC going forward.

Banking was moved from Fulton Bank to Citizens Bank to receive better customer service, improved online access and bill pay services along with better interest on money market funds and lower fees.

2026:

Excess cash will be invested in secure and easily redeemable CDs with Edward Jones. Despite the drop in interest rates, our investor finds good rates for GBC.

Leigh Ann has accomplished a huge undertaking in preparing the application for GBC to receive 501c3 status. She expects to finalize and submit in early 2026. This status will enable GBC to take advantage of significant saving on software, contracts, etc., that will reduce operating expenses.

Staff credit cards will change from Fulton to Citizens affording better online card management and improved customer service.

In the months since we returned to “normal”, there has been an emphasis on extending hospitality beyond the doors and lobby to making sure we notice who’s new, who’s missing, who might need some encouragement. Who arrives early and goes directly to the sanctuary and sits down... can we extend a warm welcome without overwhelming? We have also taken a page from the “Where’s Waldo” books to notice certain people and keep watch for them, reaching out if they are absent for more than a week.

There are currently 61 people on the email list for the Hospitality Team. That does not include some who don’t “do” email; we reach out to them in other ways. Thank you to every one of you who has served as a greeter or an usher or made and served up coffee. Some of you volunteer to serve in all 3 roles. Thank you to Tara, Trudie, and Ed who serve as leaders for service and hospitality to the Goshen family and guests.

We used 21% of the church budget to support 30 missionaries and mission agencies serving in various ways in many countries to bring the Gospel to a lost world. We added Carl & Patsy Green of Global Training Network, Chris Lovelace with The Seed Company (Wycliffe), and Jon & Alma Stream with OMF International, plus more Worldlink missionaries with unreached people groups. We have monthly Great Commission Updates during services to keep the congregation informed about our missionaries and the work the Lord is doing through them and the ministries to which He has called them.

Again, this year, we supported the Baby Bottle fundraising campaign for Chester County Connect Care. We helped support Short Term Missions for Drake Buddenhagen and Michael Rhine. We added a couple of Stories of Grace (stories from our missionaries about God's work in people's lives) on the mission's page of our church website. We distributed Christmas cards to members of the congregation to be sent to each of our missionaries. Paul Westerberg coordinated the collection of over 100 shoe boxes for Operation Christmas Child. Barb Smith coordinated the Salvation Army bell ringing.

The theme for the Fall Focus on Missions was "On the Move: Spreading the Gospel from Everywhere to Everywhere." Bulus Galadima of the Lausanne Movement preached on "Christian Hospitality and the Gospel" from Ruth 2 and taught during the combined Adult Sunday School hour. Shelby Abott with FamilyLife preached on "Answering the Purposeful Call" from Matthew 4:18-22. The Missions Team created a slide show of our missionaries which was shown before and after services and in the lobby for several weeks. Our Fall

Focus on Missions project was “Feeding Body and Soul” which provided meals to refugees and Bibles to those who have expressed a desire to read God’s Word. God exceeded our goal of \$6,000 by raising \$7,200.
