

NO CONDEMNATION FOR THE SECURE (8:1-39)

CONDEMNATION HAS BEEN PERMANENTLY REMOVED (ROM. 8:1-17)

- What does it mean that there is “no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus” (v. 1)? (Question 1)
- Why is it important to remember that we are under “no condemnation” (v. 1) based in Jesus’ work and not our own? (Question 4)
- What does the phrase “put to death” (v. 13) teach us about the attitude and approach we should have toward our sin? (Question 7)
- How are you tempted to live in a “spirit of slavery” marked by “fear” (v. 15)? How does God’s love as father speak against these feelings? (Question 10)

ADOPTION INTO GOD’S FAMILY DOES NOT REMOVE US FROM SUFFERING (ROM. 8:18-30)

- How can you more genuinely live out or reflect the perspective Paul describes in verse 18? (Question 11)
- Why should viewing suffering in your life or in the world make you hate sin? What can you do in response? (Question 15)
- What has God used to conform you to “the image of His son” (v. 28)? (Question 18)

WE HAVE COMPLETE SECURITY IN JESUS (ROM. 8:31-39)

- In what ways would your life be different if you believed you were as secure in Jesus as Paul says you are? (Question 21)
